



Our 64-credit Associate of Science degree is a three-semester step-in program with a spring start for current Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) who wish to become registered nurses (RNs). Graduates are eligible to apply for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

The hybrid delivery model consists of online courses and in-person meetings. Course work online is asynchronous, it can be completed any time of day or night- whenever your schedule allows. Labs and clinicals take place on campus and in-person at either NTC or one of our local clinical sites. Students can plan to be in-person for approximately 4 consecutive days once per month for the duration of the program.

Our programs are accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). All Nursing programs have separate applications and admission criteria/ prerequisites; acceptance to NTC is not an acceptance to the LPN Step-In program. You must be accepted into the Step-In program to enroll in ADNG courses.
